Middle schools in the area offer an introduction to and project completion of robotics career activities in GO TEC labs. Once they complete the middle school piece there is a two-year gap before the Automation & Robotics Pathway opens up again in the 11th grade. VTT, LLC (an Affiliated Company of Virginia Tech) offers a robotics camp through the Global Center for Automotive Performance Simulation program located at the Institute for Advanced Learning and Research. Rising 9th and 10th graders have the opportunity through the camp to stay engaged, excited and committed to this career path. This camp offers a bridge to the gap that exists and serves students to build their knowledge of spatial reasoning, robotic mechanisms and functions, coding, and general problem solving. The students design, build, and participate in a robotics competition as well as experience field trips to expose them to a variety of opportunities and technologies.

These feature films encourage engagement in STEM education to learners of all ages in our region. It is a great way to make learning fun!

The Great Solar System Adventure explores the sun-scorched surface of Mercury, the icy expanses of Pluto and more, to emphasize how fantastic our home planet is. Wings Over Water tells the story of the epic journey of three amazing bird families. Both of these films address information required in multiple areas of the SOL tests our students have to complete.

Second Chance Ministries provides Educational Tool Kitz 4 Kids. These kits are backpacks full of school supplies including pens, pencils, pouches, erasers, folders, rulers, notebooks, composition books, highlighters, glue sticks, custom masks, sanitizers, and pocket Bibles. Families who participate in the program have expressed that this support allows them to feel more prepared and less stressed as their children begin a new school year.



Feedback from recipients reflected that many people are not in traditional family situations and greatly benefit from the extra support. A grandmother, who is caring for her three grandchildren due to her son being incarcerated, could not afford the supplies needed. Two sisters, supporting nine children through their combined households, found emotional support and guidance through the program. A mother of six expressed her deep gratitude for the continued support over the last four years, as she struggles to make sure her children have what they need to do well in school.
