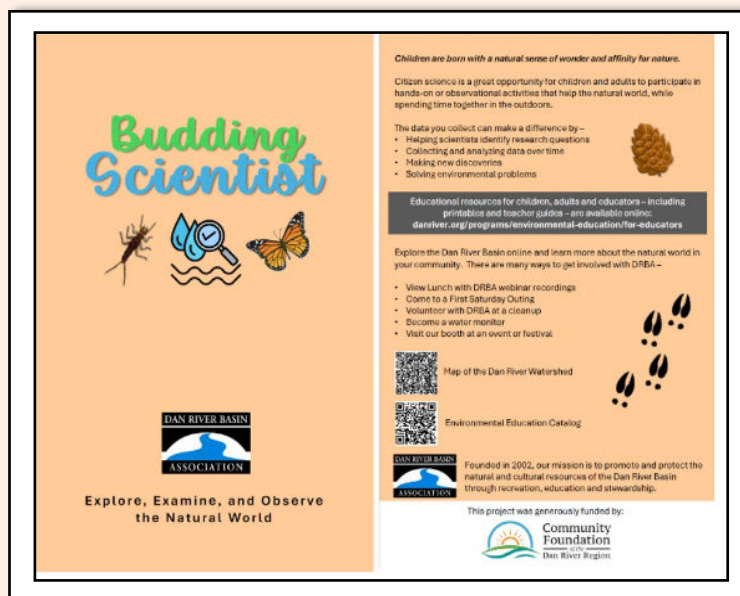

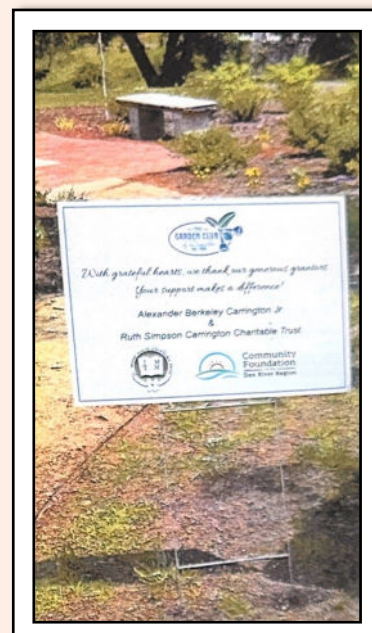

The Community Foundation's Prior Year Grant Funding In Action



Over the spring and summer of 2025, Dan River Basin Association provided 220 Budding Scientists Kits to youth at festivals and events that introduced them to citizen science, allowing children to experience and explore the natural world through inquiry and scientific investigation. In those kits observational tools and materials were included, along with a booklet designed by DRBA that introduced them to different citizen science projects that they could participate in and where to access the projects.

The Garden Club of Danville is working in collaboration with the City of Danville, Oakes Memorials and Signs and Historic Preservationist, Mr. Riley Corum, and Gravestone Conservationist, Ivan Nielson to repair, rejuvenate and restore the Old Grove Street Cemetery (1820-1920). This project preserves a portion of our history and helps keep things looking well-cared for and maintained in the City of Danville for future generations to learn about and celebrate.
